Shared mobility in Rotterdam up to now...

- Micromobility: since 2018/ Car sharing since 20th century
- No e-scooters due to (developments in) national legislation. However, there is the possibility to apply for a license
- Policy: micromobility (2020)/ car sharing (2021) -> Mainly facilitating and regulating

• Urban mobility hubs: vision on mobility hubs created and >40 small hubs set up in the city (up to 100 will be created in 2023)



... and coming up

Because of the fast developments, we:

- Update our policy, a.o.:
 - License for micromobility: quality check instead of first come first serve
 - E-scooters: start with a pilot in a restricted area
 - Car sharing: introduce zone-floating
 - Vision on mobility hubs, incl. possibility to create large roofed hubs
- Set up an action plan/program, including: behavioral approach*)
 - Unlocking the potential of shared mobility, by focusing on the demand side
 - Based on research in Rotterdam
 - Focus on:
 - 'young and hopeful (25-35)' plan and run' (35-45 with kids)
 - Specific neighborhoods
 - These behavioral steps:
 - 1. Awareness
 - 2. Consider
 - 3. Try out
