Autodelen.net's comparative look at car sharing in Amsterdam



Are cars getting bigger? Yes, Brussels finds out.

A new joint study conducted in the Brussels-Capital Region (RBC) by the public service agencies Bruxelles Mobilité and Bruxelles Environnement has highlighted a worrying increase in car volume and weight.

The freshly-released study highlights six categories of impacts: Zero road deaths and severe injuries, active travel space, just transition, air quality, climate and energy efficiency improvements and environmental and social externalities.

Webinar: Integration of Public Transport and Shared Mobility


