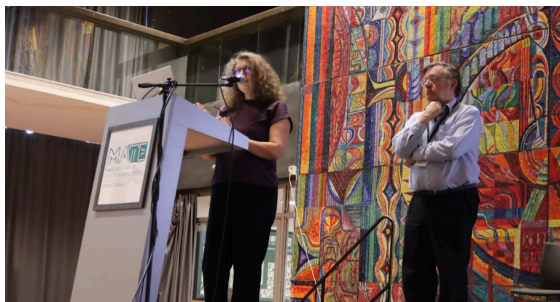
Lighthouse in the spotlight: Putte
